PRE-EMPLOYMENT TRANSITION SERVICES: SUMMER WORK

I. <u>PURPOSE OF SERVICE:</u>

The Summer Work service for students provides real life work experiences in integrated employment settings so students learn about job skills, employability, earning a salary, and job demands. These work-based learning opportunities assist students in learning about different types of jobs and work settings. ORS partners with an approved CRP, with expertise working with students with disabilities, from different geographic regions of the state, and diverse expertise with specific disabilities. This 5-day, 5-week, 20-hours per week program provides a paid work experience. This includes 20 hours of Workplace Readiness Training. The CRP provider, ORS Counselor, and student review findings and recommendations at the conclusion of the student-paid Summer Work Experience.

II. **PROGRAM ELEMENTS:**

- 1. Summer Work targets high school students with disabilities who want to spend 5 weeks of their summer working and students ready to try paid employment in an integrated work setting.
- 2. A work experience stipend of \$230.00/week or \$46.00/day based on participation and attendance. (Rate is the prevailing minimum wage).
- 3. 80 hours of paid work at one worksite and 20 hours of Workplace Readiness Training.

III. <u>EXPECTED OUTCOMES:</u>

- 1. To learn about necessary job skills.
- 2. To prepare the student for participation in employment or to be ready for training/higher education.
- 3. To expose the student to the logistics of getting to and from work, being punctual and tolerating a work schedule.

IV. <u>STEPS FOR IMPLEMENTATION:</u>

- 1. ORS discusses referral with student, facilitates a signed release of information, completes the Referral Form, and generates an authorization for PRE-ETS Summer Work (\$2,650 for 5 weeks).
- 2. The CRP accepts the referral, provides services, and completes report about student's work experience.
- 3. The CRP schedules a conference with the student, (parent if necessary), the CRP, and the ORS counselor to review the report and identify support needs/recommendations. This meeting will occur before the start of the new school year.
- 4. Bill and final report are forwarded to counselor within 2 weeks of completion of program/ conference.
