Live Captions in iOS 16

Live Captions is an accessibility feature on iOS that automatically generates text for spoken audio, both within apps and for conversations around you. It can be useful for people who are deaf or hard of hearing, or anyone who prefers to follow audio with subtitles. The new option lets users easily turn on automatic captioning in their Settings menu, which will apply to any audio played within the device, from phone calls to FaceTime sessions, to videos.

How to enable:

> Settings

- Accessibility
 - ➤ Hearing
 - Live Captions- (toggle on)
 - Adjust Appearance (Font, Text, and Background Color)
- Go back to "Accessibility"
 - General
 - Accessibility Shortcut (check Live Captions). Then you can triple click the side button to turn on and off.

> Choose Microphone or iPhone Audio

- Microphone to caption in person conversations
- iPhone Audio to caption any type of sound within the iPhone.

*Android- while it's available on many Android devices, it's not a universal feature. Specifically, Live Caption is available on devices running Android 10 or later, but it's primarily found on Google Pixel devices and Samsung Galaxy devices.
