- Go to "Settings" and select the "Accessibility" menu.
- Scroll to the section labeled "Hearing" and select "Live Captions."
- Toggle on captions systemwide or in-app.
- Adjust Appearance (Font, Text, and Background Color)

- Call captioning only works on Pixel phones.
- Non-Pixel phones all have live captions, although it isn't as easy to find and use the feature compared to Pixels.
 - > On your device, open Settings .
 - > Tap Sound. Live Caption.
 - Under Settings, you can find or change these settings: Turn Live Caption on or off. Hide or show profanity. Hide or show sound labels, such as laughter and applause. Hide or show the Live Caption icon in volume control.
